

A message from the co-chairs

With a dropout rate of 17.3% for the 2015-2016 year according to the latest report from the ministère de l'Éducation et de l'Enseignement supérieur (MEES), the region achieved and even exceeded the target it had initially set. An enormous thank you to all those who are rallying around the cause of school perseverance so that even more Estriens can thrive, persevere and succeed in their studies. Without you, none of this would have been possible.

This result is, without a doubt, the result of a collective effort of more than 13 years of concerted actions to promote school perseverance and educational success. Mobilization within a consulting authority helps not only to improve the stakeholders' capacities to act, but also to organize the environment around young people into a coherent whole. Everyone has a role to play in the educational success of our Estriens. It is through our collective efforts that we have made a difference and that we will be able to go even further. On reading this report, you will discover the extent of the 2018-2019 achievements and actions accomplished by the Projet PRÉE and more than a hundred partners who are actively involved in the various projects.

EDUCATION AS A TOOL TO MEET WORKFORCE NEEDS

An important shortage of labour problem is currently occurring in Quebec. This problem tends to encourage the premature entry of young people into the labour market, thus jeopardizing efforts to fight school dropouts. However, the educational success of our youth is a key part of ensuring that Quebec has a skilled and qualified workforce. In order to work together in this direction, three intersectoral projects are currently underway, focusing on school-work balance, the valorization and promotion of various education and training paths and finally, the mobilization of business people.



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TAKING ACTION IN EARLY CHILDHOOD FOR **EDUCATIONAL SUCCESS**

Along with these projects, we are convinced of the importance of acting early in order to make a real difference in the educational success of our young people. The Projet PRÉE has, to this end, an entire project for the first school transition on which it collaborates with a set of partners. This collaboration has resulted in, this year, the Guide titled *The Transition to* Kindergarten.

AGENTS OF CHANGE IN MATTERS OF LITERACY

Among the important issues affecting educational success from an early age is the development of literacy skills, both for the young people themselves and for their parents. The Projet PRÉE has thus continued its mandate to promote reading in the Estrie region. In addition to collaborating on several inspiring initiatives carried out by the community, the regional intersectoral reading committee organized the first Symposium on literacy in Estrie: All together for reading (Ensemble pour la lecture). This initiative brought together and mobilized more than 200 stakeholders, who left not only better equipped to help young people and their parents develop a taste for reading, but also with the mission of becoming agents of change in matters of literacy. If each and every one of us supports this mission, we will collectively generate real change in literacy in Estrie.

The 2018-2019 year has resulted in promising actions and rich partnerships that reflect our commitment to acting coherently. Together, let's make educational success a value held by all! Happy reading.





Last spring, the second edition of Hold on! was held. Again, this year, the entire Estrie region was mobilized in order to encourage students to complete their school year with as many successfully passed classes as possible and to inform them of the advantages of obtaining their diploma or a qualification. This campaign targets young people between the ages of 14 and 21 years old, attending a high school, a vocational training center, an adult education or college institution in Estrie, as well as their parents. In order to have youth-friendly messages, two new videos were created using the winning slams from the Slam your motivation contest.

Valorization and promotion of the various paths leading to educational success and integration in the labour market







On the basis of the nine findings drawn from the status report completed last year by the Projet PRÉE and the Table estrienne de concertation formation-emploi (TECFE), the mandate of the project for the valorization and promotion of the various paths leading to educational success was defined. In order to carry out this mandate, a regional action plan, complementary to what is already being done, will be developed by a Regional Committee for the valorization and promotion of training paths, comprising of around ten Estrie partners.

ACTING EFFECTIVELY IN COOPERATION AND COMPLEMENTARITY

The committee decided to examine the inventory of activities already being done in different educational institutions to value and promote various training paths. Firstly, several representatives from different educational institutions were met and a map of the Estrie region's main promotion and valorization actions will be available in October 2019. The sharing of information between institutions already suggests a good collaboration between the different stakeholders. Secondly, next year's objective is to build a regional action plan and to begin, already, implementing the first actions.

School-Work Balance Estrie







The Projet PRÉE acts as a regional resource and provides financial support for the local deployment of School-Work Balance Estrie. This initiative aims to recognize and support companies that implement measures to promote the educational success of their student-employees. Participating employers thus promote the success of the young generation, while ensuring the creation of a skilled workforce in the future. The *Projet PREE* supports local promoters in the implementation of School-Work Balance Estrie.

HIGHLIGHTS

Mobilization of business people







Given the risk to educational success and school perseverance that a context of labour shortage poses to young people, the Projet PRÉE wishes to mobilize, consult and engage more business people in concrete and targeted actions towards these goals. A project to mobilize business people was thus started this year to unite the partners of the Estrie region around a common and forward-looking project. The Projet PRÉE hopes that innovative solutions will emerge from this project in order to be able to respond to the needs of the workforce while also keeping young people in

INSPIRATION FROM OTHER REGIONS

In a first step to gather information on what is being done to mobilize business people elsewhere in Quebec, four regional consulting authorities on school perseverance and educational success were contacted and some excellent courses of action were identified. Regionally, two meetings with School-Work Balance Estrie promoters were also held in order to gain a better understanding of the local reality.

TAKING CONCRETE ACTION WITH COMPANIES AS OF NEXT YEAR

In the coming year, it is planned to establish an intersectoral regional committee that will focus on developing messages to businesses and on identifying actions to raise awareness and support companies.

This project is being carried out in parallel with the Employers committed to educational success national movement (Employeurs engagés pour la réussite éducative), led by the Quebec Network for Educational Success, which aims to achieve similar objectives: to make employers aware of the role they play in educational success and help them to adopt sound practices in support of this goal. A reflection on the possible coordination between these two projects, and also with School-Work Balance Estrie, will be done over the next year.

Regional action plan for a harmonious school transition 2017-2020











All the actions planned for this second year of the three-year action plan have materialized. Here are the main elements.

A BRAND-NEW GUIDE TITLED THE TRANSITION TO KINDERGARTEN

This year, the Projet PRÉE launched The Transition to Kindergarten guide in order to provide the different intersectoral stakeholders with a resource to foster joint efforts between various sectors and to implement activities aimed at the transition to kindergarten, while also allowing them to develop a common language. The guide is available free of charge on the reussiteeducativeestrie.ca website and more than 514 printed copies (478 FR | 36 EN) have been distributed in the Estrie region. The guide was translated thanks to the collaboration of the Townshippers' Association.

ELEVEN WORKSHOPS ON THE TRANSITION TO KINDERGARTEN

To allow for the dissemination and optimal appropriation of the guide by the concerned stakeholders, 11 workshops on the transition to kindergarten were held throughout the Estrie region. One workshop was held in each of Estrie's six MRCs and two were held in the City of Sherbrooke (eight in total) among the intersectoral stakeholders who work with children and their parents. Three workshops were also held with early childhood educators from the Regroupement des centres de la petite enfance des Cantons de l'Est (RCPECE) who work with 4-year-old children. These workshops allowed, among other things, to present the guide, to raise awareness about the region's initiatives related to the transition to kindergarten and to promote new collaborations conducive to the successful implementation of these actions. Dissemination activities also took place as part of a variety of consulting authorities. In total, 371 partners were reached. Other workshops are planned for the 2019-2020 year with, notably, future preschool teachers and future early childhood educators.

AN ESTRIE GATHERING ON THE ISSUES REGARDING THE SITUATION OF CHILDREN IN THE **REGION (COMING SOON)**

The Projet PRÉE, in collaboration with the Collectif estrien 0-5 ans and the CIUSSS de l'Estrie - CHUS, Direction de santé publique, are organizing the very first Eastern Townships Gathering: Thinking Big for our Children. It will be held on November 18th at the Hotel Chéribourg. This event, for managers and professionals working with children and their parents through Estrie organizations, aims to promote the mobilization around issues concerning the situation of children in the Estrie region. The launch of the program, as well as the registration period, will take place in the fall.

Symposium on literacy in Estrie: All together for reading

On April 2nd, the first Symposium on literacy in Estrie was held under the theme of "All Together for reading" (Ensemble pour la lecture). The event was a great success and achieved its main objectives: to equip and mobilize professionals and staff from Estrie organizations working with young people aged 0 to 20 years old and their parents, as well as to publicize the various organizations and initiatives specialized in reading that exist in the different environments and territories of the Estrie region.







MAIN RECOMMENDATION Repeat the symposium in its current form every 2 or 3 years, in order to create a favourable environment and renew the content.

Maximising the use of reading tools

Reading tools were developed to provide different environments with key resources to support parents in developing their child's interest for reading. These tools include: leaflets, posters, bookmarks and reading activities for elementary school teachers (including a reinvestment activity at home). Several actions have been undertaken to promote reading tools and thus make it possible to reach a larger number of families.

Slam your motivation Contest

In order to allow our youth to express themselves on what encourages their own school perseverance, all while exploring the literary world of slam poetry, the *Projet PRÉE*, in collaboration with *Slam du Tremplin* and *Radio-Canada Estrie*, launched the second edition of Slam your motivation in August 2018, a slam poetry contest about school perseverance.

- + Recording of slams in a studio environment as well as featuring winners live on Écoutez l'Estrie on ICI Radio-Canada Première (101.1 FM at Sherbrooke)
- + Live performances by the winners at the Salle le Tremplin
- Live performance of a professional slam poet in the winners' schools

Books as gifts

As part of this project, nearly **700 books** were donated this year by the *Projet PRÉE* to Estrie families living in vulnerable conditions. Created last year in collaboration with the *Biblairie GGC*, the project has since helped distribute nearly **2,200 books**.

Support of partners and stakeholders in the implementation of regional reading projects

De l'origine à l'œuvre

Organization: Culture du cœur September 2018 to June 2019 | Funding: \$4,500

Cultures du cœur makes possible the use of arts and culture as a tool for social intervention. The idea behind this pilot-project is to develop cultural stations in a youth center. Concretely, it is about starting from topics of interest for young people and getting them to discover the written materials on which these works are based. For example, a facilitator helps the young people compare a written work to its cinematic version. After all, even superheroes derive from the written word! Four cultural stations were held.

Visites interactives pour planifier le Salon du livre de l'Estrie (VIPS)

Organization: Salon du livre de l'Estrie **September 2018 to June 2019 | Funding: \$17,000**



The VIPS were developed in order to attract more young people between the ages of 7 and 20 to the Salon du livre de l'Estrie (Estrie book fair). They are used to enhance the experience of both the young person's visit, as well as that of the parents and teachers who are visiting with them. To do this, tools were created to prepare them for their visit to the Salon du livre. A treasure hunt was organized for elementary school students and a circuit was created for high school students so that everyone could enjoy an interactive, fun and positive experience. Four animators were trained to meet young people in 11 schools in the Estrie region. More than 4,500 treasure hunts and circuits were used during the book fair.

Collection Signet

Organization: Centre d'éducation populaire (CEP) de l'Estrie September 2018 to June 2019 | Funding: \$11,000

The Collection Signet initiative aims to provide books suitable for adults with low literacy skills of all backgrounds. A total of 300 books were selected,




thanks to the collaboration of various partners from the popular education centers and literacy centers in Estrie, as well as the parents who attend them. Identifying logos are placed on the books, available in various participating Estrie and Montreal libraries. 15 stakeholders from the library community are promoting this initiative in their libraries.

Lire aux camps

Organization: Conseil Sport Loisir de l'Estrie September 2018 to June 2019 | Funding: \$10,000

The Lire aux camps project consists of training, equipping and encouraging



period of time. To allow young people to integrate reading into their day-to-day lives, the 70 reading kits, distributed last years, were enhanced by adding more than 2,100 books and 1,400 magazines. In addition, four new turnkey activities were provided to them, accompanied by targeted books and 75 4-H Nature Club kits. 70 new board games were also distributed. The counsellors also received the "Fais vivre les livres" booklet, to ensure their success in achieving this crucial mission.

Écoute dans ma langue

Organization: Service d'aide aux Néo-Canadiens | Concertation école LaRocque-communauté September 2018 to June 2019 | Funding: \$2,500

The book Une patate à vélo (A Potato Riding a Bicycle) was interpreted into several languages: French, English, Swahili, Dari and Spanish. This story, recorded by members of the various participating communities, allows families to spend quality time reading together. Using a QR code, families can access a version of the book in their native language via a website. Eight promotional workshops took place in locations frequented by allophone

Agir efficacement en alphabétisation

Organization: Centre de services éducatifs populaires du Haut-Saint-François (CSEP) **September 2018 to June 2019 | Funding: \$7,700**



The CSEP du Haut-Saint-François organizes workshops to raise awareness among various stakeholders from different sectors (school, community, health and social services, libraries, etc.), in order to equip and help them better understand and effectively interact with parents with low levels of literacy. The professionals can also be trained in the basics of simple writing. Three literacy awareness workshops and three simple writing workshops were offered in three MRCs, reaching 58 participants from diverse sectors and backgrounds.

The mothers who took part in the education programs for mothers in Estrie (Maman futée, Groupe Mouv et



Parent-bition) are experiencing fantastic reading experiences with their children. Together with the facilitators, they explore different ways to introduce literacy in their daily routines at home and prepare activities filled with fun literary surprises for their families.

Reading Corners

Organization: La Relève | Maison des Familles FamillAction September 2018 to June 2019 | Funding: \$642.81

Access to books for our children is everyone's business. The Regional Intersectoral Reading Committee has chosen to offer family community organizations in the region the opportunity to develop a reading corner or to improve an existing corner within their organization. Two organizations took advantage of this offer.

Reading maisonettes

Organization: CEP de l'Estrie September 2018 to June 2019 | Funding: \$2,000

The CEP integration students want to spread the joy of reading around them. To do this, they painted and installed book boxes, offered by Polytech, in public places: grocery stores, dental offices, etc. As a result, 100 books were distributed in 10 waiting rooms.

Organization: Constellation du Granit September 2018 to June 2019 | Funding: \$12,828

In addition to the 10 mini-libraries that were enhanced this year, stimulating reading corners are now available in 20 businesses. Thus,

families can take advantage of waiting periods to read or develop their interest in reading and writing.

When the presence of books is not possible, parents can take advantage of other resources, such as:

- Digital reading displays that were improved in 2019 for the access of online resources for all ages;
- · Seek and finds developed by the du Granit MRC;
- Themed treasure hunts in grocery stores, including 4 new hunts, so as to be able to have fun while completing this routine task.

Lire, c'est bon partout

Organization: Constellation du Granit September 2018 to June 2019 | Funding: \$5,000

This activity allows teens to explore the basics of entrepreneurship by developing projects that promote reading in their communities. The objective is to allow them to update and refresh projects proposed for young people and carried out by young people. Seven reading promotion activities were implemented, including the distribution of books for teenagers in places that teens frequent. Nearly 900 people were indirectly affected by this project.

Books To Belly

Organization: Bury Community Learning Centre (CLC) – Pope Memorial Elementary School September 2018 to June 2019 | Funding: \$5,000

As part of this project, fun culinary workshops were conducted to encourage the engagement of English-speaking families for reading. During these workshops, targeted families came together to do reading activities and prepare a recipe. This project develops parenting skills in regard to literacy, incorporates literacy into family routines, promotes families' sense of belonging in school and promotes healthy eating. The waiting list to participate in this activity is continually expanding. In total, 44 parents and 4 grand-parents came with 53 children to the 10 workshops in Bury and Sawyerville.

Phelps Helps Literacy Project

Organization: Phelps Aide Phelps Helps September 2018 to June 2019 | Funding: \$17,000

This project involves expanding the services offered by Phelps Aide Phelps Helps, including a component to encourage reading together as a family. In addition to its tutoring program, the organization offers a wide variety of fun activities that take place throughout the community, to the delight of both children and parents. From the book club to the family craft nights, everything is a pretext to encourage families to become involved in developing a love of reading among young people. Between September and June, 12 reading activities were organized within the community, bringing together 40 parents and 60 young people. The project also allowed Phelps Aide Phelps Helps to establish relationships with seven other local organizations.



Organization: Habitations l'Équerre, in collaboration with the Table de quartier Quatre-Saisons **September 2018 to June 2019 | Funding: \$17,000**

Approximately 1,500 books are now part of the permanent Espace du livre-ensemble collection. Seventy-eight new activity sheets are available to professionals who want to start conversations with families on their social and cultural realities. More than 100 activities and 64 open periods were made possible. Several books were offered during these activites:

- 3,019 for children aged 3 to 12-years old;
- 556 for teenagers;
- 466 for parents.

Fais vivre les livres!

Organization: Collège Frontière September 2018 to June 2019 | Funding: \$7,708

This project consisted of training adolescents who live in low-income housing (OMH) buildings in the basics of facilitating literary workshops. Once

their training has been completed and their accreditation received, these savvy facilitators can be hired to provide unforgettable experiences to young children from various backgrounds and origins living in their buildings. The project also made it possible to expand the pleasant reading corners in these OMHs. Fifteen allophone teenagers were trained, and they offered 45 workshops in their communities. There are now 400 new books available in the four participating OMHs.

Spot sur les ados

Organization: Spot Jeunesse de Sherbrooke September 2018 to June 2019 | Funding: \$14,000

At Spot Jeunesse de Sherbrooke, young people aged 12 to 17 were invited to get involved in their community by collaborating on

- various projects, such as: Stories in pyjamas: 4 stories, for a
- total of 52 participants; • Saturday Cooking: 10 activities, reaching 138 adolescents;
- Neighborhood Newsletters: 3 newsletters were distributed in
- Bags of books available for francization families and teachers.

They also manage the David-Goudreault library, which continues to be updated.

Pédago-Familles

Organization: Carrefour accès loisirs September 2018 to June 2019 | Funding: \$4,000

During pedagogical days, fun and diverse activities are offered to families who want to take advantage of these occasions to improve their language, vocabulary and math skills, while at the same time playing with their families. Approximately 130 people participated in these activities. A loan system was also set up so that the participating allophone families could borrow games and their choice of the 1000 new books available.
