What strategies were uses to make the reading come alive?



- Observe the book beforereading (title, cover) • Ask questions: what will happen?
- Making predictions
- "Read" the images (not just the text), and bring the story to life.
- Use props that illustrate the story. For example, puppets, costumes, etc. Use different tones of voice and facial expressions to make reading fun.
- Involve children
