
READING-PAMPHLET

Did you know that you are helping your child learn to read and write by pointing out new words? As a parent, it is up to you to encourage your child to like reading.





Tell me a story with the help of a photo album: the history of my birth, of my grandparents, of my family, etc.



Turn the pages of the album slowly, to give me time to observe the details of the pictures.



Look at the title and the pictures of a book with me. You can ask me to point out certain objects.



Ask family and friends to give me books as a gift and to read them to me.



Let's play restaurant together. Let's make a menu with flyers and I will take orders from the other members of the family.

Sign me up at the municipal library, even if I am small, and go with me!

Listen! I would like to tell you about my day with my friends from kindergarten, etc.



Ask me to imagine what will happen in the story, from the beginning.



Read your recipes out loud, the labels of products, posters, road signs, etc. It will help me understand why reading is important.



Follow the text with your finger when you read to me. This way I understand the connection between what is written and what is said.



Read to me out loud what you have written on your message.

Do you know that a child learns by way of imitation? The more he sees you reading, the more he will want to discover the marvellous world of reading.

As a parent, you can spark interest in your child to read.

I need to know that you are there for me.





Show me that you like reading. You are a role model for me.



Leave me short messages in my lunch box, on the fridge, in my books, etc. I have a lot of fun reading them.



Let me read at my own pace.

Encourage me in my efforts. When the book is difficult, let's read it together.



Let me choose books that interest me and that increase my pleasure in reading.



Let's set aside a "reading corner" in the house where I can read in comfort: pillows, books, magazines, flyers, pencils, paper, glue, etc.



Library Hints

Read this book with me. I borrowed it from the school library.

Do you know that reading often in front of your child shows how much you like to read?

As a parent, you guide your child to success by reading with him.

I feel it when you believe in me.





Liven up the story to interest me: ask questions, change your voice, make faces, make the characters speak, add information, etc.



Read to me from time to time and let's take turns reading aloud.



As a parent, do you know my preferences? Give me a wide variety of reading material: stories, a collection of songs or poetry, documentaries...



Include reading in the daily routine: read before bedtime, in the morning, etc.



Let's build a tent with blankets and tell me a story under it using a flashlight.

Did you know that reading helps to learn, but also to be entertained, to escape, to succeed?


As a parent, be a model reader for your child.

















Read me a story. I'm always happy when you do, even though I can read now.



Take a few minutes every day to encourage me to read.



Tell me about what you read. In addition to getting to know you, I am going to find out what you like.



Give me books on special occasions. Also ask my grandparents to do the same.



Let's play together. There are several games where you have to read while having fun. You learn new words, because you have to read the rules.



Library Hints

Come with me to the municipal library and to the bookstore. Let's ask for advice from the people who work there. They will help us discover some interesting books

Did you know that you have an important job to do? That is to show your child that reading brings happiness and helps to As a parent, better understand communicate the world. the love of reading to your child by supporting him in his efforts. I like to talk to you about things that inferest me.



Do not stop reading with me! We are never too grown-up to have a story read to us. Let's read one page each out loud.



Suggest books, magazines, dealing with my favourite TV programs, films or games. I will be curious.



Give me the opportunity to read often because I want to become a good reader.



Scatter books and magazines everywhere: near my bed, in the living room, in the car.



Give me the opportunity to read at home. We will have fun together if you read me a story before I go to sleep.



Library Hints

Many municipal libraries also have a section where there are collections of games. Let's go and see if our library has one. on the way to success!

As a parent, allow your child to have his own tastes. Avoid criticizing his personal choices. Those are winning attitudes.

I still need you. Your support is important to me.



Let me make my choices. My taste is getting more specific and increases pleasure to read!



Do not stop reading with me! Let's read a little bit of everything: magazines, newspapers, books, comic books, etc.



Give me the opportunity to read often! Ask me to help you to look for information on the Internet, read a recipe, etc.



Keep newspapers around. I like to discuss things that are happening in the world.



Let's play together. Several games require reading while having fun. Ask me to read you the rules and to explain them to you.



Library Hints

Collections of DVDs, CDs and audio books are available in most municipal libraries. Let's check them out together!

Interest yourself in what I am reading. Read the same things I read. We can be reading buddies.



Encourage me to read often, a bit every day.



Take advantage of the questions I ask you to help me and find the kind of books that interest me.



Let's read together! We take turns reading pages. Ask me what surprises me; what I have learned.



Let's look at the bus schedule, find topics that interest us on the computer or a tablet. Let's consult an encyclopedia. These are good tools for reading!

The municipal library offers photo albums, novels, comic books, English and French books, magazines, atlases and informative books on all subjects. Let's go on an adventure together!
