UPON HIRING

- ✓ An up-to-date resume
- A bank account in their name
- ✓ A void cheque
- ✓ Their Social Insurance Number (SIN)
 If they need to obtain it, their birth certificate and health
 insurance card will be required.







TIPS

FOR KEEPING THEIR JOB

- Be punctual
- ✓ Show autonomy and initiative
- ✓ Demonstrate a positive attitude
- Listen carefully to instructions
- ✓ Wear appropriate clothing for the job (e.g., steel-toe boots, etc.)
- ✓ Ask questions about safety
- ✓ Inform the employer of exam periods at least 2 weeks in advance

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
TIPS

- Be able to say no
- ✓ Confirm all requests with the employer in writing
- Use appropriate and respectful language
- ✓ Inform the employer in case of absence

- ✓ The way they manage their budget

Key Points to Remember from the Law on the Regulation of Child Labor

To learn more: CNESST

14 years and under: Prohibited from working, except in special cases

16 years and under (with compulsory school attendance):

- Maximum of 17 hours per week, with 10 hours maximum from Monday to Friday, except during summer, spring break, and holiday breaks
- · No work hours between 11 p.m. and 6 a.m., except for certain jobs
- Work schedule must not overlap with school hours

18 years and under (no longer required to attend school): No restrictions
